A NEED FOR CYBERSECURITY PROFESSIONALS

Since becoming a CyberPatriot coach, I have often been asked if there is a huge demand for cyber professionals, especially in the rural areas. I always answer in the affirmative. Yes, there is a huge demand for cyber professionals in every state whether you live in the city or the country. Cybersecurity is something that is becoming increasingly more important in business, government, farming, energy, and infrastructure. The State of Texas learned this valuable lesson last summer when 25 municipalities were attacked with ransomware, effectively paralyzing them for weeks and making it impossible to access data or conduct business.

One of my favorite ways to illustrate the need for cyber professionals is sharing the Cybersecurity Supply/Demand Heat Map from Cyber Seek.


